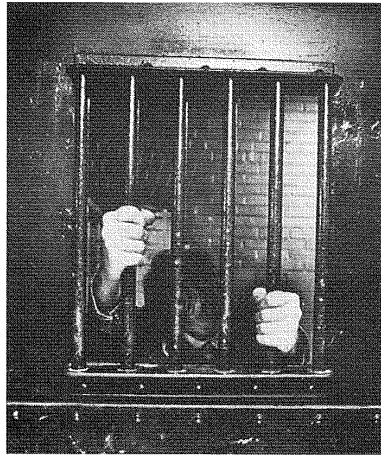


How much can you get robbing a S.C. bank?



30 years.

Bank robbery is a serious business. The South Carolina Bankers Association is serious about preventing bank robberies and prosecuting bank robbers to the absolute fullest extent of the law. Punishment is up to 30 years in prison.

Additionally, the penalties for robbing an individual in the vicinity of an ATM or other automated banking device have been increased to up to 20 years in prison. For a third offense, you can get life imprisonment.

Working closely with local law enforcement authorities and the FBI, the SCBA will actively pursue the apprehension and conviction of all bank robbers.

\$5,000 REWARD

Up to a \$5,000 reward is being offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone robbing a South Carolina commercial bank, thrift, or an individual in the vicinity of an ATM or other automated banking device.
