In this role, she is responsible for managing approximately \$25 billion in assets across 28 institutions throughout South Carolina, North Carolina, Virginia, West Virginia, and Kentucky. Amanda began her career with the OCC in 2005. In prior agency roles, she specialized in problem bank rehabilitation, working with many struggling banks during the commercial real estate crisis of 2008. She later became a problem bank specialist in the OCC's Northeast Region. Amanda also has extensive experience supervising banks involved with fintech partnerships and she earned a FinTech certificate through the Harvard VPAL program.
